The Worker's Compensation Act Part 2 Division 5 Section 31 states that an employer must establish and maintain a joint health and safety committee in each workplace where 20 or more workers of the employer are regularly employed. The JHSC:

- must be comprised of a minimum of four members,
- must consist of worker and employer representatives
- worker representatives must make up at least half of the committee members
- must have two co-chairs (one worker co-chair and one employer co-chair)

As outlined in WorkSafeBC's Occupational Health & Safety Regulation 3.27, the employer must ensure that each member of the employer's joint health & safety committee receives, as soon as practicable but no more than 6 months after becoming a member, a total of at least 8 hours of instruction and training on JHSC duties and functions.
